- Support 250 seniors and people with disabilities to remain in their home
- Employ 45 full and part-time workers in Litchfield County
- Deliver a unique set of services that no other organization can offer in the community

Chore Service is an independent nonprofit based in Litchfield County, CT. We employ local people to provide in-home, non-medical assistance to the elderly and people with disabilities so they can remain safely and independently at home. Chore serves residents in Canaan, Cornwall, Falls Village, Goshen, Kent, Lakeville/Salisbury, Litchfield, Morris, Norfolk, Roxbury, Sharon, Warren, and Washington. Chore receives federal grant funding from the Older Americans Act through the Western Connecticut Area Agency on Aging. These monies subsidize all clients aged sixty and over, regardless of income. Client contributions supplement the grant. Chore Service also receives donations from towns, churches, charitable foundations, and donors so that the program can remain affordable for everyone.
